INTO A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE

PILLAR COLLEGE, Newark, NJ: To provide the Certificate Program students with more Colleges that recognize transfer credits into the Baccalaureate, Pillar College acknowledges **24-credits** into the Baccalaureate programs in Business Administration and Management, Psychology and Counseling as well as in Biblical Studies. BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE, NJ: Students must submit a copy of their high school transcript or GED as part of their admission packet to Bloomfield College. Students who complete the Certificate Program in Christian Ministry will have the freshman Geographies of Experience course waived. Students who complete the Introduction to the First Testament and Introduction to the Second Testament of the Certificate Program will be awarded credit for two Bloomfield College courses under the B.A. in Religion program as follows:

SUNY OLD WESTBURY, LONG ISLAND: SUNY Old Westbury agrees to transfer 24 credits for the completed NYTS Certificate in Christian Ministry toward either the BPS in Business Management or the BA in Philosophy and Religion with a minor in Congregational Management. NYTS agrees to transfer 12 credits from the BPS in Business Management with a minor in Congregational Management or the BA in Philosophy and Religion with a minor in Congregational Management toward its MA in Religious Leadership and Administration (MARLA) or Master of Divinity (MDiv) degree programs. For a degree map of each curriculum, see the Appendix at the end of this agreement.

Students seeking to transfer credits from one school to the other must apply to the respective school separately, following the policies and procedures of each school. Students seeking to transfer credit from the CP to the BPS or BA, and from the BPS or BA to the MARLA or MDiv must inform the Registrar of the respective institution at time of application of their intention to exercise this option. MEDGAR EVERS COLLEGE, Brooklyn, NY: Medgar Evers College (MEC) will accept students with a two-year Certificate Program and Leadership from NYTS in advance standing with an equivalent of a maximum of 40-credits transferrable to the Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies. CP Students will be evaluated on the CUNY Assessment Tests in Critical Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Candidates requiring remediation will participate in the College's Developmental education Immersion Programs.

MEC will enroll qualifying NYTS Certificate completers in the Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies.
